Dear Love INC family:

2023 was a hard year for our neighbors. COVID era food subsidies ended in March 2023 which increased the food insecurity in our area. Inflation caused the prices of common needs such as food, utilities, fuel oil, gasoline, and many other items to increase. This was on top of the 7%-9% increases the year before. Prices remain high in the housing/rental market which is increasing housing insecurity. The demand for housing is much higher than the supply of homes and apartments which is causing prices to rise. Last year in Derry Township School District, there were 33 families/58 students affected by homelessness. The need for mental health services continues to grow, and mental health professionals are in short supply. Unfortunately, incomes are not matching pace with these increased costs. Our local neighbors are finding it more difficult to pay all their bills.

The Love INC family has seen these struggles and has helped to meet over 3,000 needs last year (up 90% over prior year). The Personal Care Closet ministry distributed over 16,000 personal care items (up 43% over prior year). The Parsonage ministry provided over 1,300 nights of lodging (up 41% over prior year). The Sneaker Distribution provided 297 students from Derry Township and Lower Dauphin school districts with brand new sneakers and socks. The Homes of Hope program celebrated a family successfully graduating and moving into their own apartment. The Faith and Finances class saw 3 families graduate from this 10-week course.

This is all possible because of YOU! Our volunteers provided over 6,900 hours of their time to help our neighbors. Because of your generous donations, Love INC ended the year in the black and had a strong start to 2024. I am so appreciative for your generosity and support. THANK YOU!

One example of the lives that you have touched is Marisa. Marisa is a single mom. Five years ago, she found herself in a hard place. She had no income and had a child in her care. She came to stay with a friend in Hummelstown. Marisa started going to the Hummelstown Food Bank and signed up to receive personal care items from Love INC. This support helped Marisa get back on her feet. At first, she was embarrassed about the situation but Love INC made her feel so welcome, comfortable, and not looked down upon. HOMES OF HOPE TRANSFORMATIONAL MINISTRY

FAITH AND FINANCES

CONNECTION CENTER INSIGHTS

The Connection Center is receiving a large increase in calls for rental assistance, utility assistance, and personal care items.

We will continue to work with partner agencies to support the rental assistance and utility assistance needs.

2024 OUTLOOK

Even though inflation rates have decreased to 3%-4%, prices for essential items are remaining high and causing financial constraints for our neighbors. We are anticipating the need for our services to remain elevated in 2024. We need additional volunteers to support the increased need. If you like to work in an office with others, we can use your help. If you like to clean or meet with guests, our Parsonage ministry can use your help. Trauma Informed Care training teaches the effects of trauma on the body and how to help others without saying things or putting people in situations that retrigger the memories of their past trauma. Trauma Informed Care training will be offered in 2024 if there is interest in the class. We offered this class in 2023 and it was well attended and very informational. This will be the same class. We are looking for a more advanced training but so far what we have found is cost prohibitive.

A **Car Repair** program is being rolled out in 2024. We are currently limiting this program to existing participants and may expand this reach later in the year. Love INC has partnered with two garages. Love INC will supplement the amount that a family can already pay toward the repair. More information will be provided later in 2024.
